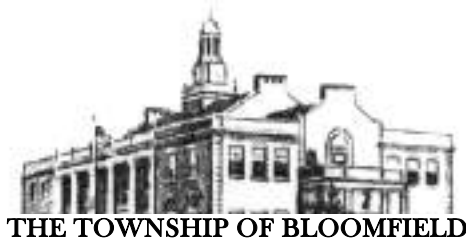

Dear Bloomfield College Student,

The Bloomfield Department of Health & Human Services Public Health Nursing Office is pleased to offer tuberculin skin testing at our office. The cost is \$20.00.

You must be able to return to the office 48 to 72 hours later to have the tuberculin skin test read and receive results.

Our office provides tuberculin skin testing Monday through Wednesday and Friday ***by appointment.***

Public Health Nursing also offers required vaccines needed for college. The cost is \$15 one-time registration fee and \$10 administration fee per visit, ***total = \$25.00***

Vaccines are administered at select times throughout the month. Vaccines are given ***by appointment only.***

You must call to schedule an appointment and for program requirements. Walk-ins will not be accepted.

*You must bring a note from college stating which vaccines are needed. The note needs to be signed and dated.*

The Public Health Nursing Office is located in the Town Hall building, across the street from the main Post Office, next to the Bloomfield Police Station. The building is on the corner of Bloomfield Avenue and Municipal Plaza. Metered parking is located off Bloomfield Avenue. The address is 1 Municipal Plaza – Lower Level, Bloomfield.
