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NOW THAT YOU ARE PLANNING TO BE A STUDENT IN THE U.S....THERE ARE THREE THINGS YOU SHOULD NOT DO!

❶DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. WITH A B-1 or B-2 VISA

Since you have already contacted Bloomfield College in regard to becoming a student, entering the U.S. on a B-1 or B-2 tourist visa would be considered “*fraudulent entry*”. Pursuing a full-time course of study in the U.S. as a B visitor is prohibited by federal regulations and would put you in violation of status. Do not listen to people who say it is easy to enter the country as a visitor and change your status to student status.

IF YOUR STUDY PLANS ARE NOT CERTAIN AND YOU WANT TO ENTER THE U.S. TO VISIT SCHOOLS, you must explain this on your visa application and ask the visa officer for a B-2 visa with the words “Prospective student” noted on it or have the words added to your B visa if you already have one.

❷DO NOT ENTER THE U.S. WITHOUT A VISA

If you are from a country that participates in the visa waiver program, which permits you to enter the U.S. with only a round-trip ticket, do not do this. If you enter without a visa, you will be permitted to stay for only 90 days. You will not be eligible for an extension of stay or allowed to change to student status. You will be required to return home and reenter the U.S. under the appropriate non-immigrant classification. Students that are eligible for the visa waiver program are required to submit the I-20 application and financial evidence to Bloomfield College. Entrance into the United States is permitted with an I-20 and a valid passport.

❸STUDENTS WHO HAVE ENTERED THE U.S. ON OTHER NON-IMMIGRANT STATUSES (for example: F-2, J-1, H-4, and other dependents) must make an appointment with the International Student Advisor to discuss their legal status. Your International Student Advisor will inform you if you are eligible for a change to F-1 status.

WHAT IS A FORM I-20 AND WHY DO YOU NEED ONE?

The form I-20 is a U.S. government document issued for the purpose of obtaining an F-1 visa to enter the U.S. under the F-1 status. It certifies that you are a “bona fide” student; have met all of our admission requirements; will pursue a full course of study at Bloomfield College; and have proven that you have sufficient funds to study and live in the U.S. without working unlawfully.

DOES EVERYBODY NEED AN I-20?

No, not all foreign students need to obtain a form I-20 in order to study at Bloomfield College. Only individuals wishing to enroll under the F-1 status need to apply for a form I-20. If you are maintaining another nonimmigrant status in the United States (except B-1/B-2 or F-2), you do not need an I-20 and may attend school full-time or part-time. Individuals who wish to pursue a course of studies in the U.S. must first obtain a form I-20 and apply to U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Services for a change of status to F-1. Dependent children in E,F, H, I, J, L, M, N, O, P, R or S status need to change status upon reaching their 21st birthday or if they marry. If you have no legal status you may attend school, but you are not eligible to change your status and do not need an I-20. Any change of status questions should be addressed to the International Student Advisor.

STUDENTS THAT ARE ALREADY IN THE U.S. ON AN F-1 or J-1 (Student) VISA

If you are already in the U.S. studying on an J-1/ F-1 visa, you must submit a new I-20/DS-2019 application and financial evidence to Bloomfield College. Once you are accepted to the college, you'll be asked to submit the **Transfer Clearance Form** and a copy of your new acceptance letter to your previous International Student Advisor. **Your SEVIS record will then be transferred to Bloomfield College so that we can issue you a new I-20 or DS-2019.**

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1) **YOU MUST BE ACCEPTED TO BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE IN A COURSE OF STUDY AS A FULL-TIME STUDENT.**
- 2) **YOU MUST PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION PROVIDING THAT YOU HAVE THE FINANCIAL ABILITY TO SUPPORT YOUR LIVING AND STUDYING EXPENSES.**
 - **Do not expect to work in the U.S. to help meet your annual costs!** *On-campus employment is limited and competitive; off-campus employment is strictly controlled by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.*
 - **Expect annual increases in tuition and living costs of approximately 10%.**
 - **Our financial requirements are not negotiable.** They represent a modest, average budget that does not include luxuries of any kind. We strongly recommend that you budget at least 10% more if possible. Too little money causes hardship and distress. We insist that students and their families look closely at the costs of living and studying in the U.S. and make careful plans to be sure your financial needs will be met.
- 3) **YOU MUST COMPLETE THE ON-LINE I-20 APPLICATION LOCATED AT www.bloomfield.edu/international AND SUBMIT THE REQUIRED FINANCIAL DOCUMENTATION.** We reserve the right to ask students to submit additional evidence of their financial capability. The U.S. government requires that we be absolutely sure that you will have enough financial support to cover the full costs of your stay in the U.S.

Financial documents may be sent by email, fax, or mail. Please submit photocopies and save the originals for your personal records. Students living abroad in need of an F-1 student visa will be required to show the original financial documentation at their appointment with the U.S. Embassy.

SOURCES OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

YOUR FINANCIAL SUPPORT CAN COME FROM ANY COMBINATION OF THE FOLLOWING SOURCES IN THE U.S. OR ABROAD.

① **FUNDS FROM "SPONSORS"** (parents, relatives, friends, organizations). You may have as many sponsors as you need. Sponsors may provide you with support in the form of cash support and/or room and board. Free room and board is when you live with someone and are not asked to pay rent or provide services.

② **PERSONAL FUNDS** that come from your own income and resources, not those of your relatives. Unless you have enough cash to support yourself for your entire program of study or can prove other sources of personal income, you will need a sponsor with an income sufficient to support you.

③ **FUNDS FROM THIS SCHOOL**, such as a scholarship. Not all college support covers the entire program of study and living expenses, so you may need additional support to meet your minimum annual costs.

→WARNING #1

It is highly recommended that **at least part of your financial support come from your home country.** This is important for obtaining your student visa because it shows that you have compelling ties to your home country.

→WARNING #2

A sponsor should promise only as much money as he or she is able to give you. Some sponsors believe that the more money they promise to give the easier it will be for you to get your I-20. **TO GREATLY INCREASE YOUR CHANCES FOR APPROVAL BY THE U. S. EMBASSY, IT IS IMPERATIVE YOU REMOVE ANY DOUBT THAT THE SPONSOR IS UNABLE TO AFFORD THE AMOUNT THEY HAVE PROMISED.** A sponsor should promise only what he or she intends to give and only as much as can be afforded.

I-20 REQUIREMENTS FOR FINANCIAL EVIDENCE

Please complete the on-line I-20 application and submit the required financial documentation directly to the Office of Admission, by email, fax, or mail.

We strongly recommend that you submit your financial evidence as soon as possible to reduce processing delays.

ALL DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED MUST BE:

❶ Less than three months old

❷ In English - It is the student's responsibility to submit a legitimate English translation.

❸ Photocopies or faxes, not originals - You will need the original documents for your appointment at the U.S. Embassy once we send you your form I-20.

FINANCIAL EVIDENCE REQUIRED:

SPONSORS OF CASH SUPPORT:

❶ AFFIDAVIT OF ANNUAL CASH SUPPORT.

All questions must be answered. For your convenience, the Affidavit of Support is included in this handout. This form may be photocopied for each sponsor.

❷ BANK STATEMENT in the name of the sponsor *only*, or a LETTER FROM YOUR SPONSOR'S BANK, which states the following:

- The sponsor's **name**
- The **bank's name** and contact information
- The **date** the bank statement was issued
- **Total balance for the checking and/or savings account**
- The bank statement must **indicate which currency is being used**

❸ PROOF OF INCOME. (Submit any of the following items)

- A letter from your sponsor's employer on business stationery which states your sponsor's name, job title, and annual salary (indicate currency). In some countries this is called a "Certificate of Employment."
- Income tax returns
- Recent pay stubs
- *If self-employed:* Income estimate by a bank or private accountant.

→Warning #3

The income of a company is not the income of the owner of the business and will not be accepted as proof of income. You must provide an official statement of the salary paid to the owner/sponsor.

→WARNING #4

If a bank statement is in the name of more than one person, each individual must submit an Affidavit of Support.

SPONSOR(S) OF FREE ROOM AND BOARD:

AFFIDAVIT OF FREE ROOM & BOARD

Your free room and board sponsor should live within a reasonable distance from the college. For your convenience, the Affidavit of Support for Free Room & Board is included in this handout. This form may be photocopied for each sponsor.

NOTE: If you are presently in the U.S., you must be living with the sponsor at the time of filing this application for this to be counted towards your means of support.

→WARNING #5

If you intend to support yourself you must prove that you have at least \$30,000 USD in a personal bank account. \$30,000 USD is the estimated annual expense for one year of tuition and living expenses.

WHAT DOES THIS AFFIDAVIT MEAN?

By completing this affidavit, you are swearing to the U.S. government that you will provide this student with a specific amount of money from your own financial resources for every year he or she is going to study at Bloomfield College and live in the U.S. You are proving that you can afford the support you are promising with the documents you have attached.

Before signing it, you must understand that you are making a financial commitment to the student that should not be broken. Sponsors who fail to provide the promised support force students to drop out of school and cause undue hardship. Do not expect that the student will be able to help support the costs through employment. Employment is strictly controlled by Immigration Services and is very limited.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING AN AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPORT

& FINANCIAL EVIDENCE:

Please fill out the Affidavit of Support in English. Promise only the amount listed on the *Estimated Annual Financial Costs* listed on page 6.

Sponsors are also asked to submit a **bank statement & proof of income** to prove that they are financially capable of supporting the student's educational and living costs for the duration of the program.

The Affidavits of Support (pages 10 & 11) should only be submitted if they pertain to you. ***Students who are fully supporting themselves through personal funds do not need to submit an Affidavit of Support.***
