- Windows XP/Vista/7**

 3. Record the *Physical Address* for the wireless adapter.

- MAC OS X**
1. Click the *Apple* icon, and then *System Preferences, Network*.
 2. Click *Airport*, and then the *Configure* button.
 3. Record the *Airport ID*.

- Smart Phone**
1. Select *Settings*.
 2. Select (Android)—*About, Status*; (iPhone)—*General, About*.
 3. Record (Android)—as shown; (iPhone)—the *Wi-Fi Address*.

POLICY STATEMENT

Bloomfield College provides technology resources to the College Community, including students, faculty, administration, alumni, and members of the Board of Trustees. Use of these resources is a privilege, not a right, and is provided by the College for educational purposes only. The College reserves the right to limit or restrict access to these technology resources.

All members of the Bloomfield College community who share the technology resources of the College must use those resources in a responsible manner. All users are bound by local, state and federal laws relating to technology use including copyrights, security, and electronic media. All users must adhere to the highest standards of ethics and academic honesty and must respect the rights of others, the integrity of system security and College controls, and all contracts and license agreements.

All users are responsible for knowing the appropriate use policy and guidelines. Individuals who misuse these technology resources may have their use privileges terminated and may be held personally liable. Unauthorized use of these facilities or providing access to unauthorized individuals is prohibited. College resources are not to be used for illegal or commercial purposes. Under appropriate circumstances, the College retains the right to examine and copy any files or information that exists on College computer systems. Users who do not adhere to these policies are subject to revocation of their computing privileges and other sanctions.
